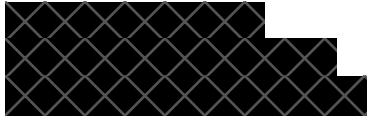

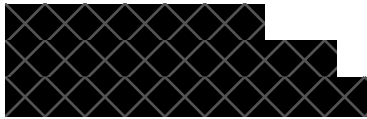

Comment : It's been reported that incarcerated parents at ACJ are being denied visits with their children unless they can provide a birth certificate listing the incarcerated parent's name, even when a family court order authorizes visitation. This deviates from ACJ's posted policy, which requires proof of guardianship from the adult accompanying the child-not the incarcerated parent. Has ACJ's visitation policy changed? If so, such a practice disregards court authority, harms children, and unfairly separates families. It also ignores complex family structures, creates unreasonable bureaucratic barriers, and deepens the trauma of incarceration for children and families. Furthermore, being named on a BC in PA does not establish paternity.

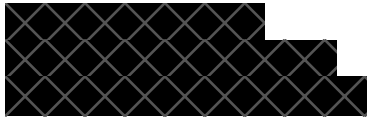
